Elementary Template Tasks (BETA)

Literacy Design Collaborative (LDC) [template tasks](#) aim to help teachers craft Common Core-aligned tasks that engage students in writing in response to reading. When filled in, a template task becomes a teaching task that sets up a context for teaching the specific skills and demands embedded in the Common Core standards. The teaching task serves as the foundation of a literacy-saturated instructional module.

The [original collection](#) of LDC template tasks was designed for use in grades 6-12. Numerous teachers, literacy coaches, and administrators soon after took the initiative to use the LDC framework at the elementary level, and created and successfully used their own template tasks for grades K-5 based on the original collection. The LDC community of practice has since identified the need for a consistent, comprehensive, and vetted collection of LDC template tasks to make available to all elementary teachers.

This “beta” collection of elementary template tasks has been collectively designed and revised by a working group of elementary LDC teachers, coaches, and other practitioners, and it includes 22 template tasks, respectively, for grades K-1, 2-3, and 4-5. LDC is making the entire collection available with the goal of having elementary LDC users “beta test” these template tasks in the pursuit of gathering feedback and suggestions for revision over the next several months before this collection is finalized and published.
